



THE RISE OF THE NEW AGE

New Age beliefs are growing in popularity and often borrow from pre-Christian or pagan faiths. Even among Christians, it's not uncommon for some New Age beliefs to be held. These include four main characteristics: (1) a belief that spiritual energy can be located in physical things (2) belief in physics (3) belief in reincarnation (4) belief in astrology. These beliefs are most held by:



RELIGIOUS VS. SPIRITUAL IN THE NEW AGE

Many people have come to recognize the difference between religion and spirituality. Whereas religion focuses on a specific set of organized beliefs and practices shared by a community or group of adherents to its teachings, spirituality is more focused on individual practice and beliefs regarding bigger concepts, such as the meaning of life or attaining inner peace.
